## COINCIDENCE OF RESULT OF REVALUATION AND SUPPLEMENTARY EXAM

Usually it takes three months to complete the whole procedure of revaluation. Normally those students who have applied for revaluation also apply for supplementary chance since there is no time to wait for revaluation result. If a candidate's revaluation result is received after a date of attending supplementary chance of that subject and if he secures a high mark in the supplementary chance, he may opt the supplementary mark, it being higher than the mark secured in revaluation. This concession is allowed only if there is carry over benefit and hence neglected in cases of first year marks. This is not an established rule, but a human consideration presuming a likely chance of his improvement appearance in the supplementary chance if he had passed in revaluation before the supplementary exam.

Since there is no carry over of First year marks and also since no improvement chance for first year, this concession is not allowed to First year subjects. So also this is not allowed to Final year since supplementary appearance of Final year is neither carried over nor improved. At present this procedure is applied to Revision 2003 Scheme.
